Wilshamstead Parish Council Bedford Borough Council Local Plan Latest

At the time of writing there is no further update on Bedford Borough Council's Local Plan document. The Local Plan is the key strategic planning document for the local authority that sets out the allocations for development as well as the associated planning policies that will be applied in terms of supporting growth with suitable infrastructure. The granted extension from the Inspector remains in place with no further information from the local authority at present on the work being done and needed to be completed in just a few months on showing where development is to go.

Update On Wilstead Planning Applications

There has been no change to any of the three large planning applications for new houses, to please remember that even though the consultation deadlines have passed please note the local authority can still accept planning comments from members of the public and will be able to take these into account. So there is still time to have your voice heard regarding:

24/01566/MAO an outline planning application for the erection of up to 149 dwellings and associated works at land to the South East of Duck End Lane.

24/02231/MAO outline application demolition of existing buildings and erection of up to 95 residential dwellingsat land at Village Farm, 85 Cotton End Road.

24/02463/MAO 375 houses proposed by Wates development for land south of Wixams which is within the parishboundary of Wilstead.

To view the supporting documents for the proposed 375 houses, plus the other two, head to the Borough Council website and the planning portal, please enter 24/02463/MAO in the search bar for south of Wixams, 24/01566/MAO in the search bar for the South East of Duck End Lane, and enter 24/02231/MAO for 85 Cotton End Road.

As such, there are now Enhanced LRGs and LRG Communities.

The Enhanced LRGs are made up of those wards and parishes which have land that would need to be permanently acquired, and land that would be used temporarily for construction. The LRG Communities are those that were a part of the previous LRG structure but now fall outside of having land directly impacted but allows members to remain informed on the project and part of the conversation. Renhold has been advised they are now part of the LRG Communities Group. The first of two expected webinars this year for this group is scheduled to take place in late 26th March and feedback will be shared in a future article.

Highways Improvement Works Update

The Parish Council were pleased to see the work is underway for the footway works for Hampton Close, Phipps Close and Morgan Close carried out by the local authority as part of their capitals work programme improvement scheme. There have been some snagging items noticed that have been followed up with Bedford Borough Council.

There has been continual engagement between the Parish Council, senior Highways Officer and Borough Councillors on the range of highways safety improvements within the village, looking to implemented. There has been a further site meeting to keep the dialogue progressing whilst refinements are made to ensure the works have maximum benefit.. These include greater double yellow line coverage and a 20mph zone for the village centre as some of the items looking to be implemented.





Obviously it was quite alarming. There was no sight of anyone outside. We put this down to a very childish prank. However at 21.45hrs that same evening it happened again.

We can think of no reason why we should be targeted other than a clear getaway is possible from our property.

The perpetrator of this stupid prank should understand that it is very alarming for the house occupants be startled like this late at night. It is not remotely funny to startle people and could lead to serious consequences both for the startled persons (especially elderly) and the perpetrator of these stupid pranks.

Car Drivers and Horses

Be particularly careful of horse riders, especially when approaching, overtaking, passing or moving away. Always pass wide and slowly. When you see a horse on a road, you should slow down to a maximum of 10 mph.

Be patient, do not sound your horn or rev your engine. When safe to so, pass wide and slow, allowing at least 2 metres of space.

Horse riders are often children, so take extra care and remember riders may ride in double file when escorting a young or inexperienced horse or rider. Look out for horse riders' signals and heed a request to slow down or stop.

There was a recent incident at the Stables in Wilstead, and it was only thanks to the skill of the horse riders that a serious accident was avoided. Please be thoughtful when you see horse riders on the road.


