Wilshamstead Parish Council

Planning Application For Up To 149 Houses At Duck End Lane **Recommended For Refusal**

The Borough Council Planning Committee made up of elected Borough Ward Councillors members, who considered this planning application at their November meeting have made a recommendation for this application to be refused. The members heard from Borough Ward Councillors Marc Frost, Graeme Coombes, Andrea Spice and Parish Councillor Mark Brooks who all spoke passionately with robust planning policy reasons as to why this application should be refused.

The Parish Council response collated by an experienced planning consultant who had provided professional advice with detailed technical and robust challenge to the local authority to this planning application at Duck End Lane, was sent directly to each elected member of the Planning Committee in advance. The application had gone to committee recommended for approval, so this collaborative working, including all the public submissions from the Wilstead community showed unity and strength with a clear message that this application was not in keeping with the wishes of the community.

Enormous thanks to all those who took time to submit comments to the application and to those who represented the community at the Planning Committee meeting.

The next steps are the application will return to a future Planning Committee, with the Planning Officer having prepared supporting planning policy reasons for a refusal. committee members will vote, and a decision notice will then be issued. There will not be allowed to be any input from Borough or Parish Councillors during this meeting as the right to speak representations have already been made, however, this item will be monitored closely by the Parish Council.






