Wilshamstead Parish Council

Planning Permission Granted For Up To 95 **Houses On Cotton End Road**

Bedford Borough Council Planning Committee having met on 19th May to formally consider the application 24/02231/MAO outline application demolition of existing buildings and erection of up to 95 residential dwellings at land at Village Farm, 85 Cotton End Road deferred taking a decision due to consideration being given to include certain items in the planning conditions that it was expected would be applied to the application, in light of the Planning Officer recommendation to the elected members for granting approval.

The Planning Committee reconvened again on 16th June to further consider the application. In line with the Committee regulations, as this was a further consideration taking place, it was not possible for elected Borough Ward Councillors, Parish Councillors or any other parties to address the Committee members during their discussions. Following the further discussions, the Committee agreed to again defer the decision for this planning application as members had not been satisfied with the proposed planning condition outcomes. The Committee had also requested a site visit to look at Cotton End Road in terms of the highway access to the application site. The site visit is 9.30 am on Monday 30th June.

It is pleasing to see the Planning Committee taking such careful deliberation over this application and the Parish Council will continue to monitor the application closely, with it being expected to return back to the Planning Committee meeting scheduled for 14th July.

Bedford Borough Council Local Plan June 2025 Update

Bedford Borough Council has been working on its 2040 plan to set the agenda for the next 15 years, but the likely impact of Universal means the landscape has now changed.

A letter to the Council from Darren McCreery of the Planning Inspectorate said; "Given the implications of Universal, the likely outcome of a review and the work following it would be the production of a fundamentally different plan to the one submitted...



"Such changes, including how to realise the opportunities of Universal, are instead best discussed with local communities outside the scrutiny of a plan examination. This would more closely align with the National Planning Policy framework's aim of a genuinely plan-led system, with plan-making creating a framework for meeting needs, addressing priorities, and a platform for local people to shape their surroundings."

He added, "In terms of taking things forward, in the combination of specific circumstances presented in this case, I see no reasonable way for the examination of the Plan to continue.

"Instead, I would strongly recommend that the plan is withdrawn and that the Council resolve to work in partnership with their local community to bring forward a new plan, away from the scrutiny of an examination."

It is therefore expected that the Borough Council will withdraw the plan and issue an update on their next steps shortly.

Wilshamstead Parish Neighbourhood Plan Review

At the June Parish Council meeting, Councillors discussed the importance of safeguarding the parish against speculative planning applications in light of the current challenging position Wilstead finds itself in. With unexpected changes to national and local planning policy framework that could not have been foreseen, the Parish Council are taking pro-active steps to expedite a suitable review in a timely manner to protect the village from unsuitable development.

Reporting Issues -Where To Raise Them

The Parish Council are mindful that it can be difficult to know where to report an issue, so here is some useful information on where it is best to send items.

If you come across a highway issue on a road, footway, or a public right of way, such as a footpath or bridleway, then please report it to the local authority via the many different reporting forms online at the Borough Council website. If there is an environmental issue, such as litter, fly tipping, noise, bins, graffiti, abandoned vehicles, then please make contact with Bedford Borough Council again using the online reporting tool so the matter can be recorded and progress monitored. Highway Safety In The Village

The Parish Council would like to remind all members of the Wilstead community to be considerate of one another when it comes to keeping the roads, footways, and footpaths safe for all users to access.

This is a polite reminder to ask please do not park vehicles over driveways, or nearby property entrances as this does in fact cause access issues for others. Not only in regard to access but this also brings a highways safety issue for all road users as it also dangerously limits the visibility and sight line when entering and exiting a driveway.

A lot of work has been done by the Parish Council to work Officers across various different departments at Bedford Borough Council, along with the Borough Ward Councillors, the local community Police team as well as local businesses to improve highways safety. So please do not place waste bins, traffic cones or other objects onto the village highways, for a short or prolonged period of time as this causes a hazard.

Please remember that if a situation arises where there is a vehicle parked dangerously, causing an obstruction or limiting visibility then Bedford Borough Council are who should be contacted as the local highways authority do have appropriate powers that can be used.





Bedford Borough Council will issue fines (penalty charge notices or PCNs) for the following types of illegal parking:

- parking on yellow lines
- not displaying a valid parking ticket
- parking on pavements or verges where a restriction is in place
- parking across driveways or dropped curbs

They do not get involved with neighbourly disputes or inconsiderate parking. To report an illegally parked vehicle, please contact the Enforcement Team on enforcement.team@bedford.gov.uk or 01234 718359. Or text only enforcement requests to 07553895403. An enforcement officer will respond to your request as soon as possible, but they may not be able to do so immediately if they are patrolling elsewhere in the Borough. Please note you won't get a reply about the outcome of an enforcement officer visit; however, the Parish Council would encourage residents to report concerns directly so appropriate action can be followed up.

Overgrown Hedges

As usual at this time of the year the Parish Council's attention has been drawn to problems caused by hedges that have grown to the point that they are either obstructing pavements or are a hazard to users of the pavements. At the extreme pedestrians are required to walk on the road, and in some instances brambles in hedges have caused physical injury to pedestrians who did not see them in the dark.

The pavement is the responsibility of Bedford Borough Council, but anything growing behind the back edge of the pavement and growing over it is the responsibility of the occupier. In extreme instances, Bedford Borough Council can cut back a hedge, but it may then send an account for the cost of the work to the property's occupier.

It is appreciated that in the short term a severe pruning of a hedge will reduce its attractiveness, hedges. unless thev are conifers. do recover quickly. If you have a hedge please check it, and if it is intruding into the footpath can you cut it back, please?

It is always more interesting to attend a Parish Council meeting in person to see what goes on and understand the range of items covered in trying to move improvements for the Wilstead community forwards. Dates and the agenda are advertised on the village noticeboards, with meetings usually on a Monday starting at 7pm in the small hall at Wilstead Village Hall. (Head to the left-hand side of the main hall building and you will see the door open which is where the Parish Council will be). Everyone is most welcome to join us, with next meetings scheduled for 21st July.


If you're interested in art and would love to try out your talent, why not join us?



P3 Footpath Group

Meetings

The next meetings of the Footpath Group will be at 10.00am on **Saturday 2nd August** and **Saturday 4th October** in the small hall of the Village Hall.

As usual there will be reports on the condition of all the Public Footpaths and Public Bridleways in the parish. Any problems with overgrowth, be that hedges or trees, or undergrowth e.g. long grass, will be identified and action agreed to address them.

The reports will also cover the current state of each path's furniture e.g. kissing gates, waymark posts, finger posts etc and identify where these need to be improved so that it is easy to understand where the paths go.

The intention is to keep these Rights of Way walkable in suitable footwear. (We can't always ensure that all the paths are able to be walked in sandals throughout the year!)

If any of these problems are too large for the Group to tackle or new furniture is needed then help will be requested from Bedford Borough Council

Come along to the meeting if you would like to help ensure that these off road links between the various parts of the village, be they Public Footpaths or Public Bridleways, are easy to find and use - all are welcome.

Working Parties

There have been few problems with the Footpaths and Bridleways around the village so far this year but if you do find any please contact the group on the number below and we will try and resolve them.



Working Parties to address issues raised by the group's two monthly inspection of all the 11 miles of Public Rights of Way in the Parish will be arranged at each meeting.

Any material needed to resolve these problems, e.g. new waymark posts, will be requested from the Borough Council or purchased by the Group.

If you find any problems when going along the paths and bridleways around the village please contact me, see contact details below.

Walks

The Friday 13th June walk around Silsoe was not unlucky! and the Group had a fine evening to walk paths through woodland and open countryside taking in the very small hamlet of Higham Gobian, which still has its own church of St Margaret and ancient fish ponds.

The walk continued back to and through Wrest Park to emerge in Silsoe where refreshment was sought at the Crown and Sceptre.

The next walks are planned for **Friday 11th July** (probably between Great Barford and Blunham, partly along the riverside) and **Friday 15th August**. Both leaving the Village Car Park off Whitworth Way at 6.30pm.
